In November, the Hall of Fame announced the names of nine individuals, four teams, and one family who will be inducted that evening. In addition, they announced the names of two long-time contributors to our Hall of Fame who will be recognized with Honourary Life Memberships. They will be inducted in June, 2024. Individuals were Ryan Boguski (Brandon), Eleanor Callow (1927-1974), Ollie Schroeder (Winnipeg), Derek Shamray (Oak River), Ken Sharpe (Minnedosa), and Bryan Swaenepoel (Souris).

Under the team's category were Kinosota Cougars (Senor Club Team, 1965-1970), Manitoba 1977 Summer Games Team (Special Team), 2010 Manitoba Junior League All Stars (Special Team), and Oil Dome Bantam All-Stars. 1990 (Special Team).

Under the Family Category - In southwest Manitoba, the Ross Family (Reston) is regarded as the First Family of Baseball.

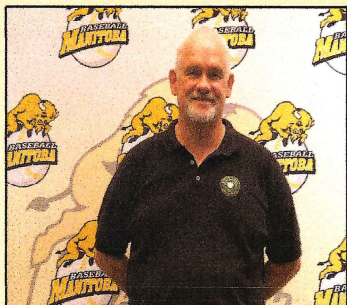

Hank Lemoine

Hank was born on October 17th, 1954, in Winnipeg. He lived in St. Vital. And attended Glenlawn Collegiate. He worked at CN Rail for 38 years, now retired since 2012.

Lemoine has play and important role on the Manitoba Baseball stage.

MJBL Allstar & Provincial Champion in 1975 with the St. Boniface Legionaires. He was also a multiple time Provincial Champion with the Carmen Goldeye Senior Team. Hank is currently a local professional umpire with American Association of Professional Baseball.

Hank has continued involvement in the Manitoba baseball community. He is currently the Chair of the Dinner Committee and Game Committee of the Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame. As an active umpire, he is affiliated with the Manitoba Baseball Association. Lemoine considers is most memorable achievement is being “Inducted as a player in the Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame in 2010. 10 Hall of Fame inductions in 6 Halls of Fame.”

Hanks volunteer roles brought him the most satisfaction has been coaching Bison and Junior age players in St. Boniface in the 80's and well as instructing young umpires at the Home Run Sports Centre.

Hank is currently working as a Rail Consultant which has taken him to most major cities in North America. He has also officiated High School Fall Travel Ball, Senior AAA Men's, NAIA & Division 3 College Baseball in the USA.



Ross Tycoles

Ross Tycoles was Born in Saskatchewan where he played baseball until his early twenties. He played and coached the Reston Rockets after moving to Manitoba. He has coached at every level and is still involved with the Reston Minor Ball. Diamond maintenance is still something he enjoys while working with the board on facilities.

On the Manitoba Baseball stage, Ross was first a player in the late 70s in Mb. He has always involved in the organizing end of baseball in Reston and the SW Manitoba League.

“I coached at every level of baseball in Manitoba except Junior. I also served time on Baseball Manitoba board and coaching staff. I currently am on the Baseball Hall of Fame board and am the Chair of Senior Baseball.” emphasized Tycoles.

Ross is committed to the Manitoba Baseball community because of his love for the game and the people.

Tycoles is proud to be in the Hall of Fame, and his family's nomination into the Baseball Hall of Fame was his most memorable achievement. “I am proud of all of them and their commitment to the game and their communities,” added Ross.

Ross, how has been a volunteer brought you satisfaction?

“The feeling of seeing Baseball thrive in our community and province is very satisfying. I have wanted to improve Baseball my whole life and hope others continue on with that same feeling,” concluded Tycoles.
